Meanwhile, her mother Lamia Zreik and two sisters fled Syria for Gaziantep, Turkey from where they also applied for asylum to USA.

Sibongile Mkhabela	Barloworld Empowerment Foundation			Sibongile "Bongi" Mkhabela is a social worker, activist, and leader whose life's work has been dedicated to advancing social justice and the rights of children. She currently serves as Chief Executive Officer of both the Nelson Mandela Children's Fund and the Nelson Mandela Children's Hospital Trust, where she has led groundbreaking efforts to transform how South Africa cares for its children. Under her leadership, the Trust successfully completed a R1 billion campaign to build and equip the Nelson Mandela Children's Hospital, only the second of its kind in Southern Africa, providing world-class tertiary paediatric care, training, and research. Bongi's activism began early. As a student leader, she played a pivotal role in the 1976 Soweto uprising—an event that reshaped the anti-apartheid struggle. She was one of the "Soweto 11," charged with sedition for her role in the protests, and spent several years imprisoned, an experience that deepened her lifelong commitment to human dignity and the empowerment of African women. Her career reflects a remarkable blend of grassroots advocacy, civil society leadership, and international service. From founding the Zola Advice Office to advocate for communities living under apartheid, to shaping research and policy at the Development Resources Centre, Bongi has consistently worked to build strong partnerships between civil society, government, and international institutions. She has held senior roles with the United Nations Development Programme and served in the Office of Deputy President Thabo Mbeki, overseeing civil society-government collaborations and the implementation of the UN Children's Charter.
				A graduate of the University of Zululand, she is also a Joel L. Fleishman Civil Society Policy Fellow at Duke University, has pursued business management studies at the University of the Witwatersrand, and was a Rockefeller Foundation Fellow in Bellagio, Italy. She has served on several boards, including TrustAfrica (Senegal), the Global Philanthropy Alliance (USA), and Barloworld, where she chaired the Ethics and Transformation Committee. In recognition of her tireless advocacy and leadership, Bongi has received numerous honors, including South Africa's National Order of Luthuli (Silver) in 2022. She is also the author of Open Earth and Black Roses, a novel that weaves together personal testimony and collective memory of life under apartheid. Through her activism, leadership, and storytelling, Bongi Mkhabela continues to embody the fight for justice, equality, and the well-being of Africa's children.

Thaline Karajá





Thaline Karajá is an Indigenous Brazilian singer, songwriter, mother, and environmental activist from the Iny Karajá people. She made history as the first Indigenous person in the world to participate in The Voice, using her platform to celebrate Indigenous culture and call attention to urgent global issues. Through her music and activism, Thaline uplifts the voices of her people while advocating for environmental justice and sustainability. For her, sustainability is not just an individual lifestyle choice but a collective responsibility to respect limits and live in balance with the Earth. She reminds us that in a globalized world, we must still look closely at our surroundings and recognize that the planet demands care rather than exploitation. Thaline's work bridges tradition and contemporary expression, offering both a powerful artistic presence and a committed voice for the environment and Indigenous rights.
